NOTIFICATION OF RIGHT TO PUPIL RECORDS

The adult or parent of a minor pupil has the right, upon written request, to have the pupil's records made available to them. The adult pupil or parent of a minor pupil has the right to challenge the content of records to insure their accuracy. With certain specific exceptions, information will not be disclosed from a student's education records without prior written consent of the parents and a statement to the effect that if parents believe the district has violated their rights, they may file a complaint with the Department of Education, Family Education Rights and Privacy Staff. Copies of School Board Policy JR: Student Records may be obtained at the pupil's attendance center, the Special Education Office or from the Central Administration Office, 101 Second Avenue, Baraboo, 355-3950. The board policy defines student records, specifies confidentiality and identifies the right to challenge the content. The board policy further specifies the maintenance of records for their transfer.

NONDISCRIMINATION

The Baraboo School District does not discriminate against pupils on the basis of sex, race, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap in its educational programs or activities. Federal law prohibits discrimination in employment on the basis of sex, race, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap in its educational programs or activities. MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION

If a child needs to have any medication, including over-the-counter drugs, given to him or her during the school day, certain forms must first be filled out by parents and the physician. Contact the school office or the School Nurse.

EMERGENCY CONTACTS

Be sure to provide the school office with your current home and work phone numbers as well as the names and phone numbers of others who can be notified in the event of illness or injury. This should be done on your child's emergency card at the beginning of the school year.

HEAD LICE

Head Lice is expected to continue to be a nuisance this school year. Inspect your child's head for the presence of lice before school starts. If you suspect that someone in your household has head lice, call your physician or the School Nurse.

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The Baraboo Public Schools operates full service Special Education program(s) as required by State and Federal Statutes. Programs are available for students with mental, physical, emotional and learning disabilities which, if the full potential of the child is to be obtained, requires educational service to the child to supplement or replace regular education. Children with the following conditions may require special education: autism, cognitive disability, emotional behavioral disability, hearing impairment, specific learning disability, orthopedically impaired, other health impairment, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment, significant developmental delay. Special education programs serve children from ages 3-21. All students involved in the special education classes have their needs identified by an evaluation team.
